Why Girl Scouts?

New research affirms that Girl Scouts is linked to success! Girl Scouts shine above their peers in leadership, academics, career aspirations, and hope for the future!

Girl Scouts are more likely to:

Leadership Outcomes

- Have a strong sense of self (80% vs. 68%)
- Have positive values (75% vs. 59%)
- Seek challenges and learn from setbacks (62% vs. 42%)
- Develop and maintain healthy relationships (60% vs. 43%)
- Exhibit community problem-solving skills (57% vs. 28%)

Academic Achievement

- Earn "excellent" grades (53% vs. 45%)
- Expect to graduate high school (88% vs. 83%)
- Expect to graduate college (70% vs. 60%)

Career Aspirations

- Desire a career in STEM (26% vs. 14%)
- Pursue their goals (74% vs. 67%)
- Think about their future (71% vs. 66%)

Hope for the future!

- Expect to have a great future (73% vs. 64%)
- Work collaboratively (86% vs. 61%)
- Take an active role in decision making (80% vs. 51%)

METHODOLOGY: An online survey was conducted by the research firm Decision Analyst and consisted of 3,014 girls (1,507 Girl Scouts, 1,507 non-Girl Scouts) aged 5–18. Quotas were set by age, race/ethnicity, region, and family income to achieve a nationally representative sample.

Delivering Fun with Purpose!

The Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) encourages girls to Discover themselves, Connect with others, and Take Action to make the world a better place. Guided by supportive adults and peers, Girl Scouts engage in ageappropriate activities that are girl-led, cooperative, and hands-on.

5 Reasons Girls Should Participate in the Girl Scout Leadership Experience

For Girls, By Girls In Girl Scouts, girls get outdoors, participate in the cookie program, earn badges and awards, and much more! When these Girl Scout activities are girl-led, cooperative, and hands-on, girls show greater benefits.

It's About the Journey Leadership Journeys are core to Girl Scouts because they teach girls to create solutions for issues they care about most.

Role Model Behavior

Adults play an important role in shaping girls' experiences. They make girls feel valuable, and become lifelong role models.

Lead the Way Fact: the GSLE builds girl leaders. In a recent study, 3 in 4 girls say that because of Girl Scouts, they have become a leader in more activities with their friends, classmates, and community.

Girls Rule

When girls come together, stuff gets done. Girl Scouts have "fun with purpose" by gaining valuable life skills and amazing new experiences while having fun and building friendships!

How to Renew

Step 1: Log In

Go online to www.girlscoutsatl.org. On the main page, select **MYGS/Sign In**, then scroll down and select **Member Profile**. Click here to manage your troop members.

Step 2: Renew Your Troop

Log in using your username and password. (Reset your password by selecting "Forgot Password".)

Select the Troops tab at the top of the page. If you lead multiple troops, a drop down menu will show all troops available to renew. **Renew ONE troop at a time.** Confirm the drop down menu in the upper right says next year.



Step 3: Troop Roster

Your roster of troops appears below. You can renew members in the troop. (*NOTE: If unsure, select "I'll decide later.*")

Hit Continue. You can add members (girl or adult) and their registration type.







Step 4: Adults

Adults have the option to choose a Lifetime Membership. Important! As an annual adult or lifetime member, it's very important to renew your volunteer role as well. You can select multiple roles (co-leader, treasurer, etc) and no additional payment is needed! **Don't forget to select your volunteer role**.

Step 5: Payment

Before payment, you must agree to the Girl Scout Promise and Law!

Select your Annual Donation Amount on behalf of the Troop. You can make a collective donation through the Payment option during the renewal process, and it is added to your total.

Engineering Think Like an Engineer

Learn how to think like a designer by participating in handson design challenges and completing a Take Action project.
