Submit online ASAP: Registration Form and payment

FAQs

What time do we need to arrive at camp on Friday?

Check in is 4:30 – 6:30 pm. Dinner is served at 7:00 and there will be a leader meeting at 8:00 during the campfire and s'mores sing-along. A movie will be shown at 9pm for Cadettes and up.

How do we get there?

The address for Camp Twin Lakes is 1391 Keencheefoonee Rd, Rutledge, GA 30663. It generally takes 1 to 1.5 hrs to drive there on Friday and less than an hour to drive home on Sunday.

When can we decorate our cabins?

You may decorate your cabin any time after you arrive Friday. There will be free time Saturday for you to decorate as well. All cabin decorations must fit in two Rubbermaid containers, and cabin decorating must be completed by 5pm Saturday.

Are there any awards or prizes?

Awards will be given for cabin decorations, skits, costumes, most spirited troop—possibly others TBD!

How are the cabins set up?

Cabins are heated and have A/C. Cabins sleep 12 in twin beds + 2 on the floor. Each cabin has 2 showers, 2 sinks, and 2 stalls.

What do I pack?

Do we need to bring any money?

Bring cash only if you're stopping for a snack on the way to or from camp. There's nothing to purchase at camp.

What activities are planned?

Saturday morning will include several activity blocks. We'll let you know which ones you'll need to "sign up for" at the camp (ie: paddle boats, etc.).

During free time in the afternoon, campers may visit the camp's amazing treehouse or play miniature golf, tennis, or a variety of ball games on the back field.

What can a daisy troop do at camporee on Saturday?

All activities except those restricted by age by Girl Scouts (ie: archery).

Are snacks available throughout the day?

The dining hall is open 7am – 10 pm and has cheese sticks, PB&J, apples, milk, and yogurt available. And coffee or tea for tired leaders!

Do we have to have a skit for the talent show?

No, but we will encourage campers to wear their costumes to dinner on Saturday so everyone can enjoy them.

What kind of skit should we plan for Saturday?

Anything! Songs, dances, comedy routines, and skits have been performed. Please keep it G-rated and under 4 minutes. We strongly encourage skits and decorations made and planned by the girls. For music, please have it loaded on your phone, etc. (downloaded no streaming).

What is a swap and how many should we make?

A special whatchamacallit attached with a pin! Make a little trinket to trade with your sister scouts on Sunday after breakfast. About 5-10 per Scout should be plenty, and each girl should have some to share if she would like to collect.

What time do we leave on Sunday?

Sadly, we return to regular life by 11:30 Sunday. There will be a posted check-out list so we can leave our campsite cleaner than we found it!
